Easter and The Resurrection

We are nearing the time of Easter, commemorating the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for our sins and rose the third day fulfilling Scripture that states, that he took our infirmities (Matt.8: 17) and by His stripes we are healed (Isaiah 53:5). 

KNEELING FOR NEW ENGLAND

The Church of the living God, under the auspices of Visionary and Senior Pastor, Rev. Gloria Nelson, hosted its sixth annual prayer breakfast, "Kneeling for New England" on February 23, 2008, at the Sheraton Braintree Hotel. As customary, the mood of the breakfast was one of celebration and excitement, praising and edifying God in worship, song, and prayer. Associate minister, Rev. Dr. Bettye Craft was the mistress of Ceremony and Associate minister, Rev. Cherie Nelson was the coordinator of the event.

This year, the focus was on the youth with some of the proceeds of the breakfast going to establish a scholarship fund for at-risk youth. Rev. Nelson, during our telephone interview on Wednesday February 27, 2008, at 12:30p.m, explained the reason for the change. "God prompted me to address the issue of violence that is taking place in city streets, in schools, in suburbia, and around the world." She explained that the youth breakfast purposed to provide: "an outreach to youth, to educate, create awareness," and consensus among the body of Christ regarding "where our young people are heading spiritually, educationally, and economically." Additionally, it gave the body of Christ an "understanding of the seriousness of gang violence and the need to find methods to address, intervene, and stop the violence in city streets."

"The question to ask ourselves," explained Rev. Nelson is, "What will Jesus do?"

The breakfast began with praise and worship by Teen Challenge of Brockton. Minister Cynthia Harden blessed us in song. Andrea Baptiste, Founder of Lotus Foundation and Rev. Mathew Gibson, Director of Nexus Boston, led youth workshops.

Morning Star Baptist Church and Church of the Living God Christian Youth Fellowships provided a theatrical performance where youth replayed and relived the emotional pain, including abuse, they had experienced in their childhood. They expressed the loneliness they felt from not being allowed to tell a parent or family member about the abuse, that resulted in fear, anger, and self-hate that seemingly walked with them throughout their lives. These feelings further lead to a vicious cycle of violence where young people are continually hurting themselves and others, tearing whole communities apart, bringing pain to families: mothers, fathers, grandparents, brothers, sisters, cousins, friends, and others. The make shift coffin they presented was symbolic of the pain, grief, and sadness they bore when a family member or friend fell victim to violence.

Rev. Herold and Rev. Rose Auborg, Rev. Dr. Nerissa Clark, Rev. Ronald Cooper, Rev. Deanna Danglad, and Evangelist Princess Cadero led participants in prayers of intercession; and Rev. Roland Cooper's focus was on a call to repentance. Associate Minister, Ann Johnston, read a Scripture passage taken from the book of Isaiah 65: 19-24.

The keynote speaker for the event was none other than Rev. William E Dickerson II, of Greater Love Tabernacle Church, Boston, MA. Pastor Dickerson has been an ardent vessel for peace in the city, mediating between the police and street gangs and being a listening ear to those who are incarcerated.

Rev. Dickerson began his message by stating that, **“Youth should not be viewed as the leaders of tomorrow, but as the leaders of today.”**

He prayed that God would:

- Touch the young people
- Deliver sons and daughters from the hand of the enemy
- Strengthen, anoint, and empower fathers, mothers, and youth to live a holy life for God said: ‘Be holy as I am holy’ (1 Peter 1:16)
- Cover the children with the blood of Jesus
- Restore marriages
- Give parents the ability to set parameters and boundaries for their children
- Deliver fathers from drug dens
- Deliver women from physical and emotional abuse
- Deliver families from the cycle of one-parent homes

He rebuked “violence,” “rage,” and prayed for “peace” and “righteousness” to prevail in the city, and for youth to be “clothed in love and humility.” He called for repentance, citing the divorce rate among Christians, and stating that the enemy was making a “mockery of God.”

He called for the Church to pray as never before and challenged the Church to take the anointing of prayer to city streets and not focus on being “sanctimonious as if it they never sinned.” He continued by stating that, “Prayer would tear down principalities and powers” of darkness and violence that hover over our cities. He suggested that parents sit down with their children, teach them the word of God, and encourage them to turn to Christ.

At the close of his message, Rev. Dickerson called the young people, as well as parents and others, to come to the front of the podium to join him in repeating the following prayer:

Dear God,

I come to you and ask you to forgive me.

I believe Jesus died but rose for me.

Today, I accept Jesus as my Lord and Savior.

I repent of my sins.

I want to live for you in Jesus’ name, Amen.

DIRECTIONS TO EASTERN NAZARENE COLLEGE

From the North:

Take interstate 93 South through Boston and on to the South East expressway, which is interstate 93. Take, Exit 12 marked 3A Neponset, Quincy. Follow the exit road as it circles under the expressway and bears right up over the Neponset River. The roadway will then curve to the left under the sign Squantum and Wollaston Beach. and will take you on to Quincy Shore drive. Wollaston beach will be on your left. Take a left on to Elm Hill Ave, which is a narrow side street with a park on both sides. Look for the administration building at 23 East Elm Ave.

From the West:

Follow Mass turnpike through the turnpike extension and on to I93 S and SE expressway. Take Exit 12 marked 3A Neponset, Quincy. Follow the exit road as it circles under the expressway and bears right up over the Neponset River. The roadway will then curve to the left under the sign Squantum and Wollaston Beach. and will take you on to Quincy Shore drive. Wollaston beach will be on your left. Turn right on to East Elm Ave. The main administration building will be on your right.

From the South:

Take route 93 N to exit 8 furnace Brook and exit to the right. Follow to the 5th set of lights to Hancock Street. Take about half of a mile to Elm Ave and turn right bear right to Elm Ave. Bear right on Elm Ave. Go to the end of Elm Ave to East Elm Ave. The main administration will be on your right at 23 East Elm Ave.

From Boston By subway: Take an outward Braintree train on the red line to the Wollaston stop. Exit the station to the left and walk to the stop sign on the first street which is Greenwood Ave. Turn right to Greenwood and walk one block to Beele Street. Turn left on Beele Street and walk three small blocks to Hancock Street. Turn right on to Hancock Street and go two blocks. At the traffic light turn left on to Elm Ave. Follow to the end where it splits in to East and West Elm Ave. Bear right on to East Elm Ave and you will see the main entrance to the college. It will take approximately 15 minutes to walk to the college from the subway.
